

**Board of State and Community Corrections:
Strengthening Law Enforcement and Community Engagement**

In June 2016, The California Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) awarded 10 cities and counties with state grants to implement programs that focus on strengthening law enforcement and community relations. The BSCC Strengthening Law Enforcement and Community Relations Grant funds collaborative law enforcement-community approaches that aim to improve, strengthen, establish or re-establish positive and meaningful relationships between law enforcement and the communities they serve. This grant program is in alignment with President Obama's Task Force on 21st Century Policing, which was created to strengthen community policing and trust among law enforcement officers and the communities they serve.

The City of Long Beach Police Department (LBPD) is further advancing its efforts to foster open communication between law enforcement and the communities served through the implementation of the Strengthening Law Enforcement and Community Relations grant. Program elements include: 1) Twelve community police academy programs which aim to build trust by educating community members on police protocol and procedures; 2) Six community-and youth-police dialogues, offering the community meaningful opportunities to connect with police and share mutual experiences; 3) The implementation of procedural justice and implicit bias trainings for all sworn LBPD officers; and 4) Community engagement through social media. Long Beach Police Department engages in positive non-enforcement activities with a particular emphasis on residents living in communities with higher rates of police contact. Through this program, LBPD aims to improve communication and trust between law



enforcement and community members in an effort to create safer neighborhoods for all Long Beach residents.



SAFE LONG BEACH

In May 2014, the Long Beach City Council adopted the Safe Long Beach Violence Prevention Plan (Safe Long Beach) to address a broad safety agenda aimed at reducing all forms of violence, including domestic abuse, child abuse, elder abuse, hate crimes, bullying, gang violence, and violent crime. Rather than accepting that violence exists and trying to prevent it, Safe Long Beach draws upon the City's many existing assets to target violence at its root and build a safer Long Beach by 2020.

VISION: Long Beach residents live in safe families and communities, attend safe schools, and are contributing citizens connected to their community.

United States Department of Justice National Forum on Youth Violence Prevention

- Long Beach is one of only five new cities last year selected to join the Forum and receive a grant aimed at preventing youth and gang violence.
- In November 2014, the Long Beach City Council formally accepted the grant and designation, which will enable the City to apply for additional federal grant awards to implement Safe Long Beach.
- The Forum now consists of 15 U.S. cities working together to raise awareness and drive action through coordinated prevention, intervention, and enforcement strategies.

My Brother's Keeper

- Long Beach has accepted the White House Challenge to build a My Brother's Keeper (MBK) Community, and implement new ideas for achieving positive life outcomes for youth.
- In January 2015, the Long Beach City Council adopted a resolution supporting President Obama's initiative to help close the opportunity gaps facing youth, and ensure that all young people are able to reach their full potential.
- This initiative calls upon City leaders to further rise to the challenge by organizing a Local Action Summit, forming a Task Force, and launching a plan of action.

California Gang Reduction, Intervention and Prevention Program

- The City has been awarded a three-year, \$1.5-million California Gang Reduction, Intervention, and Prevention Program (CalGRIP) grant to support anti-gang efforts and prevent victimization of at-risk female youth.
- Referred to as *My Sister's Keeper*, the grant will be aimed at preventing gang membership and gang victimization among at-risk females between the ages of 10 and 24 years.
- This is the seventh consecutive year that the City has been a recipient of the grant. Since 2008, over 2,200 Long Beach youth and families have been served by CalGRIP funded programs and services.

LONG BEACH SEGURO

En mayo de 2014, el ayuntamiento de Long Beach adoptó el programa Plan de Prevención de la Violencia Long Beach Seguro (Long Beach Seguro), con el fin de abordar una extensa agenda de seguridad destinada a reducir todas las formas de violencia, como el maltrato doméstico, maltrato infantil, maltrato a las personas de la tercera edad, delitos motivados por prejuicios, intimidación, violencia de pandillas y delitos de extrema violencia. En lugar de aceptar que la violencia existe y tratar de prevenirla Long Beach Seguro recurre a los muchos activos existentes de la ciudad para luchar contra la violencia desde su raíz y construir un Long Beach más seguro para 2020.

VISIÓN Los residentes de Long Beach viven en familias y comunidades seguras, asisten a escuelas seguras y son ciudadanos contribuyentes conectados con su comunidad.

Foro Nacional sobre Prevención de Violencia en la Juventud del Departamento de Justicia de Estados Unidos

- Long Beach es una de las cinco ciudades que el año pasado fueron seleccionadas para unirse al foro y recibir una subvención destinada a prevenir la violencia en la juventud y de las pandillas.
- En noviembre de 2014, el ayuntamiento de Long Beach aceptó formalmente la subvención y designación, lo cual permite a la ciudad, solicitar la concesión de subvenciones federales adicionales para implementar Long Beach Seguro.
- Actualmente el foro consta de 15 ciudades de EE. UU. que trabajan juntas para crear conciencia e impulsar la acción a través de la prevención, la intervención y estrategias de aplicación de la ley coordinadas

My Brother's Keeper

- Long Beach ha aceptado el desafío de la Casa Blanca de construir una comunidad *My Brother's Keeper* (MBK) e implementar ideas nuevas para lograr resultados de vida positivos para la juventud.
- En enero de 2015 el ayuntamiento de Long Beach adoptó una resolución que apoya la iniciativa del presidente Obama de ayudar a cerrar las brechas de oportunidades que enfrenta la juventud y garantizar que todos los jóvenes puedan alcanzar su máximo potencial.
- Esta iniciativa invita a los líderes de la ciudad a hacer frente al desafío mediante la organización de una cumbre de acción local, la formación de un grupo de trabajo y la implementación de un plan de acción.

Programa de Reducción de Pandillas, Intervención y Prevención de California

- La ciudad se adjudicó el Programa de Reducción de Pandillas, Intervención y Prevención de California (CalGRIP), de tres años y \$1.5 millones para apoyar los esfuerzos contra las pandillas y evitar la victimización de las mujeres jóvenes en riesgo.
- Conocida como *My Sister's Keeper*, la subvención tendrá como objetivo evitar el ingreso a las pandillas y la victimización por pandillas de las que son objeto las mujeres en riesgo entre los 10 y 24 años de edad.
- Este es el séptimo año consecutivo en que la ciudad ha sido beneficiada con la subvención. Desde 2008, más de 2,200 jóvenes y familias de Long Beach han sido favorecidos por los programas y servicios financiados por CalGRIP.



HOW TO START A COMMUNITY WATCH GROUP

ABOUT COMMUNITY WATCH

Community Watch is an extremely effective crime prevention tool that brings the community and the police together to deter crime and make communities safer. The program's "block-to-block" approach allows you to get to know your neighbors and your beat officers, and will teach you how to make crime prevention a part of your daily routine, simply by watching out for each other.

The program does not require frequent meetings and does not ask anyone to put themselves at risk. Participants are asked to report suspicious activity to police and let them handle the situation. To start a Community Watch in your neighborhood, please see the map on the reverse side of this flyer to identify the Neighborhood Services Specialist in your area.


TIPS & TOOLS FOR SUCCESS

- **Be Inclusive** — involve people with different backgrounds and ages to reflect your whole community
- **Hold Regular Meetings** — hold regular meetings to help members get to know each other and to decide on program strategies and activities
- **"Window Watchers"** — ask people to be "window watchers" when they are home, looking out for children and reporting any unusual activities in the neighborhood to police immediately
- **Translators** — be willing/capable to translate all information into other languages needed by non-English speakers in your community. If necessary, have a translator at meetings.
- **Remember ... You Are Not the Police** — remind members that community watch groups are not vigilantes and should not assume the role of the police.


CONSEJOS PRACTICOS Y HERRAMIENTAS UTILES

- **Sea Incluyente** — involucre gente con diferentes nacionalidades y edades para que reflete toda su comunidad.
- **Sostengan Juntas Regulares**— sostengan juntas regulares para ayudar a los miembros a conocerse y decidan en estrategias y actividades para el programa
- **"Vigilante de Ventana"** — diganle a las personas que sean vigilantes de ventana cuando esten en casa, mirando a los ninos afuera y reportando cualquier actividad inusual de la comunidad a la policia inmediatamente
- **Traductores**— sea dispuesto/capaz de traducir toda la informacion en otras idiomas necesarias para la gente que no habla Ingles en su comunidad. Si es necesario tengan un traductor en las juntas.
- **Recuerde... Usted No es la Policia** — recuerdele a los miembros del grupo de vigilancia que no son vigilantes y que no deben actuar ni tomar el papel de la policia.
